## Inside the Cardinals

**RETURNING OFFENSIVE LEADER:** Arion Clanton, Sr., RB — 46 carries, 316 yards.

**RETURNING DEFENSIVE LEADER:** Arion Clanton, Sr., DB — 56 tackles, 3 INTs.

**EVERYBODY'S ALL-AMERICAN:** Tyree Purham, Sr., WR/DB. "Tyree has the work ethic of a person who is going to succeed on the field and in life," said first-year coach Stacy Adams. "Most of that came from his older brother (Qaadier) who played here. Tyree is doing everything right, asking the right questions on how to get better. He will outwork anyone on your team."

**HE'S GOT NEXT:** Everett Coleman, Jr., QB. "He's 6-3, about 180 and can throw a football through a wall," Adams said. "He's a pocket passer who can also be elusive and has got that 'feel' for the game and the position."

## The Times' breakdown

New coach Stacy Adams has wasted no time enforcing a positive attitude with the Cardinals, who are 43-57 since 2000 and 1-10 in postseason play. His seniors hope to go out with a bang, confident of their team's overall speed and athletic ability. Everett Coleman threw for 644 yards and eight touchdowns last season. Montel Smith showed his versatility by averaging 5 yards per carry and 11 yards per reception. The defense, strengthened by seven returning starters, has size and no shortage of leadership with Clanton, Smith (24 tackles), Coleman (35 tackles) and Ivan Dunbar (43 tackles, 5 sacks). This may be the season E.C. Central can finally take pride in its football program. — **AL HAMNIK**

## East Chicago: Clanton excited to become EC's featured back

If you would have asked East Chicago Central two-way starter Arion Clanton last season if he preferred offense or defense, he would have said defense.

This season?

It's offense.

And you can't really blame him. The senior simply is excited to take on an increased workload as a running back for the Cardinals.

Clanton ran for 400 yards and two touchdowns on 46 carries last season, getting about half the number of attempts of now-graduated Brandon Cole. The Cardinals have other dangerous players on offense, including emerging junior quarterback Everett Coleman, but Clanton should be the main man in the East Chicago backfield this season.

"I just have to practice hard, work hard, show the rest of the team and hope they follow," Clanton said. "As a senior, a lot of underclassmen look toward you for guidance. I just want to help the other guys learn as much as possible.

"I set my goals high — over 1,000 yards. Hopefully I can get close to completing them." Pure speed is Clanton's forte — "In my eyes, I think I'm one of the fastest people in the region," he said — and he has been striving to hit the hole more quickly and to become a more physical, downhill runner.

"Arion is a multi-threat person, with great speed," East Chicago coach Stacy Adams said. "He runs the ball very well. He can also catch the ball (Clanton had 10 catches for 200 yards and two touchdowns last season). We don't have to go to a three-receiver set; we can just put him out there."

Clanton also starts at cornerback for the Cardinals, typically drawing the assignment of covering the opponent's top wide receiver.

"I look at it as a challenge," Clanton said. "Knowing the coaches have the confidence in me to do that, it gives me the mentality that I can guard anybody."

Clanton had 36 tackles and four interceptions last season.

"He's a lock-down corner," Adams said. "We're going to play a lot of man coverage, and we have no problem putting him out there on an island against a team's best receiver."

Former Valparaiso University coach Adams said Clanton has a 3.8 GPA, and colleges "from Butler to the Ivy League" have been looking at him.

"My mom makes me stay in the books, and I know how important that is," Clanton said.

"You never know which colleges are going to be watching, so I just try to do my best at all times. That's been my goal since I was little — to play football in college."



## Cardinals hope to win over their football critics

EAST CHICAGO | Sometimes, it just takes a group of kids who've had enough of being labeled and a new leader who challenges them to look in the mirror and like what they see.

If you've played football at East Chicago Central, a quick glimpse in that mirror has been tough to take since the 2000 season -- the last time the Cardinals won a playoff game.

But new coach Stacy Adams and a talented group of athletes out to prove Central is not a basketball school with a dying football program.

"We have some great athletes out here on this football field and if we can protect our quarterback (Everett Coleman) and give him enough time, we should be able to score some points with the weapons we have," Adams said.

Among the most dangerous is wide receiver/defensive back Tyree Purham, determined to make his senior year a special one.

"He will outwork anybody on your football team," said Adams, a 1984 Lew Wallace grad and the first option quarterback for then-coach Dave Templin.

"I'm never satisfied with what I do because I know everytime I'm off the field, there's always somebody getting better than me," Purham said. "And I want to be the best.

"This year, we have way more chemistry and I feel we're going to do a lot of big things. People underestimate our football team so we're going to prove everyone wrong."

Changing doubters into believers won't be a walk across the street for the Cardinals, who've had only two winning seasons since 2000.

Purham, also a track standout, will use his 4.4 speed on both sides of the football and credits older brother Qaadier, who played last year, with planting that competitive seed.

This summer, it wasn't unusual for Purham, Coleman and a few of their teammates to throw, catch and run patterns on their own at school.

"A lot of people say we're lazy and we slack off but little do they know we work very hard," Purham said. "We take pride and one of the things we all love is running, going hard."

When's the last time you heard an EC football player say that?

## Coleman Throws for Five Touchdowns Cardinals take flight over Hammond E.C. 45, Hammond 26

Cardinals quarterback Everett Coleman threw for five TDs.

EAST CHICAGO | Much like a basketball matchup between E.C. Central and Hammond High, the season opener between the schools featured excellent athletes with big-play capabilities.

Cardinals quarterback Everett Coleman and Wildcat quarterback Antwion McGee dueled in the air the entire game, but it was Coleman and the Cardinals who prevailed in a wild 45-26 victory.

The first half featured a fantastic display of passing as the two combined for 529 yards passing and six touchdowns.

East Chicago started the season in quick fashion. On the first possession, Coleman connected with Anthony Williams on a 19-yard touchdown pass to open the scoring at 6-0.

On their second possession, Coleman and Williams connected on a 74-yard pass to give E.C. Central a lead of 12-0 after one quarter. "It was a bit of a problem that we scored too quickly," said E.C. Central coach Stacy Adams. "We had to keep sending the defense out without much rest."

McGee then went to work in the second quarter, completing a 66-yard touchdown pass to Michael Peavy. McGee and Peavy would connect later in the quarter for a 23-yard touchdown pass.

"McGee did an excellent job with what he had on the field," said Hammond coach Dedrick DeWalt. "I'm very pleased with Antwon, he really showed leadership."

Coleman's magic continued in the second as he threw scoring passes of 62 yards and 91 yards.

Hammond trailed 26-12 late in the second quarter when their defense stepped-up with their own big play. Defensive back Elijah Spearman returned an interception 49 yards to cut the E.C. Central lead to 26-18 at the half.

East Chicago's special teams jump started the third quarter as Arion Clanton returned the opening kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown. That was the only score of the quarter as the Cardinals took to the ground in an attempt to run the clock and keep the ball from McGee.

McGee and the Hammond offense sputtered in the second half as they could only complete four passes for 23 yards. "We focused on playing man-to-man and not letting their receivers get behind us in the second half," Adams said.

"We just couldn't run the ball, we couldn't get any push from the offensive line," said DeWalt.

For McGee, the problem was the plays they didn't make. "We had too many drops which I guess are part of first game jitters," said McGee. He finished the night passing for 303 yards.

Everett Coleman had five touchdown passes and threw for 270 yards in the win.

"We knew it would be a battle of the quarterbacks," said Adams. "Everett wanted to go out and show that he is the best in the area."

## Lake Central turns up heat in second half against ECC

EAST CHICAGO | Two series into the second half, Lake Central had shaken off its rust and become the football team it knew it could be.

On the first series -- all three plays of it -- the Indians scored from 2 yards out, taking full advantage of great field position courtesy of a long kick return.

On the second series -- all four plays of it -- Lake Central scored from 5 yards out, taking full advantage of great field position courtesy of an E.C. Central penalty.

After a tie game at halftime, the Indians walked off with their first win of the season on Friday, a 36-14 victory over the host Cardinals.

"In the first half, they played hard the first half, we were just sluggish," said running back Tanner Redlarczyk, who had three of the Indians' five TDs, two on the ground. "It just took motivation in the second half to have the whole team play hard, and when everyone plays hard, we do well."

The Indians and Cardinals took a 14-14 tie into halftime, East Chicago forcing Lake Central to play from behind most of the first half.

At halftime, first-year Indians coach Brett St. Germain asked his team to lose its sluggish tendencies.

"He said we have tendencies and we have to break the habit of starting slow," Redlarczyk said.

"Our kids have to learn tonight that we will perform how we practice and that's not to say we're a bad practice team," St. Germain said. "We're a team that takes a while to get going, and what we're really trying to get our guys to understand -- what happened tonight? We came out sluggish and had to have halftime motivation to get going -- as we move on, we won't win ballgames that way."

E.C. Central, which took leads of 6-0 and 14-0 in the first half, was plagued most of the game with penalties. The Cardinals finished with 21 flags for 157 yards of penalties.

Quarterback Everett Coleman, who was E.C.'s biggest offensive producer, only threw for 114 yards.

"We've got to become a more disciplined ball team," Cards coach Stacy Adams said. "When we got behind, we saw them revert back to some of the things they did last year, like getting down on themselves when they fall behind."

The 59ers also had to weather a storm of sorts from head coach Phil Mason, who during a timeout on the team's first possession of the game gave his offense an earful.

"We just didn't line up right," Mason said after the game. "We made a very fundamental mistake on a base play. This team has to develop a little bit of savvy, and they still haven't done that. They're very absolute in everything they do, and they've got to be able to adjust."

Whatever he said during the timeout seemed to work. The 59ers responded with a touchdown drive of their own, capped off by a Mason Zurek 1-yard plunge, to go up 7-6. They never looked back.

On their next possession, 59ers quarterback Demetri Blanco gave another indication -- like he did with a four-touchdown performance to start the season -- that the two years he waited to become the man behind center might have been worth the wait.

His 56-yard touchdown burst put Andrean up 14-6. Zurek added a 3-yard TD less than three minutes later, and a Rick Johnston 16-yard run gave the 59ers a 28-6 lead at the half.

A bevy of E.C. Central penalties didn't help the Cardinals' cause. Coleman finished 10-of-23 for 217 yards, including a 45-yard first-down completion to Williams on third-and-38. The 59ers scored touchdowns on their first six possessions, cruising to a 42-6 fourth-quarter lead before the Cardinals finally got back on the board with a Arion Clanton 19-yard touchdown run. But it was too little, too late.

Six different 59ers crossed the goal line, led by Zurek's two TD runs. The junior finished with 21 carries for 112 yards. Zurek said the team responded well after the Cardinals' opening score.

"I think we were just flat, especially after the Merrillville game last week," Zurek said. "But them scoring, and us being flat, it just made us energetic."

## Undefeated Valpo football team dominates E.C. Central

VALPARAISO | Think a 39-point blowout doesn't mean much in the big picture of the Class 5A playoffs?

Think again.

Times No. 1 Valparaiso dominated E.C. Central 61-22 Friday night in a Sectional 1 opener, as expected. However, it meant a lot to those involved. The Cardinals (5-5) exited Viking Field with tears in their eyes, sorry to see their season come to an end. But their pain was eased somewhat when Valpo coach Mark Hoffman gave them some words of encouragement, along with a sack lunch and a drink for the bus ride home.

"They played with passion," Hoffman said. "They played hard, had no quit in them, and it was a no-nonsense game."

Valpo (10-0) dominated almost from the start, scoring on seven of nine first-half possessions to build a 49-0 lead at halftime. Hoffman began substituting late in the second quarter, and reserves played the entire second half.

"We did what we had to do," Hoffman said. "We played 74 kids tonight. We have to work on some things."

It was a big night for Valpo's Simms family.

Greg Simms, a senior fullback, carried seven times for 49 yards, including a 3-yard touchdown midway through the second quarter.

His sophomore brother, Stephen, is a speedy tailback who saw a lot of playing time after the break. Stephen Simms rushed seven times for a team-high 76 yards and also had a 3-yard TD run in which he had to elude a couple of defenders in the backfield before sprinting to the end zone. Their father, Greg Sr., is one of Hoffman's assistant coaches. Hoffman couldn't recall another time when two brothers scored a touchdown in the same game for the Vikings.

The Vikings' leading rusher on the season, junior Bryon Duncan, was on the sidelines and did not play. He's suspended for violating the school's athletic code.

Valpo dominated statistically, racking up 319 yards of offense in the first half while building the big lead.

Sophomore running back Andrew Kittridge started off the scoring with a pair of first-quarter touchdowns. Senior Dan Marchetti added his first TD of the season on a 7-yard run late in the first quarter.

Quarterback Paul Andrie went to work in the second quarter, throwing three touchdown passes. Adam Thoma caught two (20 and 16 yards), and Dan Hummel snagged a 14-yarder in the left corner to close out the first-half scoring.

"We got out-schemed and out-disciplined," E.C. coach Stacy Adams said. "I didn't realize what they were doing until it was too late, so it was my fault."

The Cardinals provided some fireworks in the second half, as senior Arion Clanton had a 97-yard kickoff return in the third quarter. Anthony Williams, who had six catches for 65 yards, caught a 17-yard TD from Everett Coleman, and Coleman had his own score on a 3-yard run.

"They did a nice job," Hoffman said. "They're scary, because of their athleticism, but they haven't been playing the game long enough."

Valpo finished with 502 yards of offense, including 382 on the ground spread among 10 players

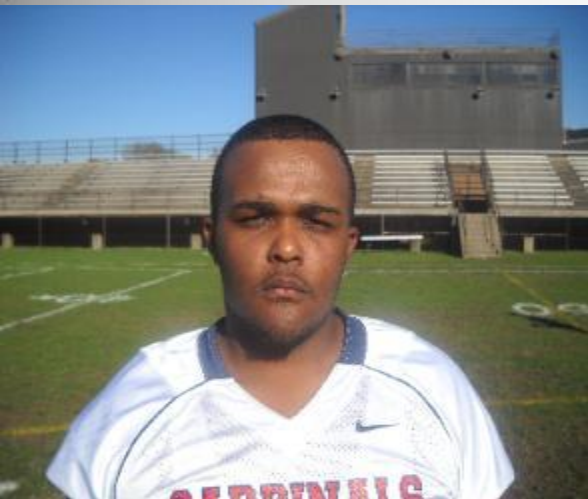
